**H.E. Ms. Battsetseg Batmunkh,
Minister for Foreign Affairs of Mongolia**

Ms. Battsetseg Batmunkh holds a Bachelor's Degree in International Relations from the National University of Mongolia. Additionally, she obtained a Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration from the Institute of Finance and Economics in Mongolia and a Master's Degree in Business Administration from Maastricht School of Management in the Netherlands. Ms. Battsetseg Batmunkh worked as Vice Minister of Foreign Affairs of Mongolia between 2016-2020, and has been working as the Minister of the Foreign Affairs of Mongolia since January 2021.

**H.E. Ms. Annalena Baerbock
Federal Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Federal
Republic of Germany**

Ms. Annalena Baerbock holds an undergraduate degree in Political Science and a Master of Laws in public international law. She began her political career by being elected to the Bundestag in 2013. From 2018 to 2022, Ms. Baerbock served as the co-leader of Alliance 90/The Greens, a political party in Germany. In the 2021 federal election, she was chosen as the party's candidate for the position of chancellor, making her the first Green Party candidate for chancellor and the second woman to be nominated for chancellor by a major German political party, following Angela Merkel. Since December 8, 2021, Ms. Baerbock has been serving as the Federal Minister for Foreign Affairs.



**H.E. Ms. Catherine Colonna
Minister of Europe and Foreign Affairs of the French
Republic**

Ms. Catherine Colonna holds a master's degree in Public Law and a postgraduate degree in Public Law. She is also a graduate of the Paris Institute of Political Studies and the National School of Administration. Ms. Colonna began her diplomatic career in 1983 at the French Embassy in Washington. Previously she served as the French Ambassador to Italy and San Marino, to the United Kingdom as well as the Permanent Representative of France to UNESCO. On May 20, 2022 she was appointed as the Minister for Europe and Foreign Affairs of the French Republic.



**H.E. Ms. Olivia Ragnagnewendé Rouamba
Minister of Foreign Affairs of Burkina Faso**

Mrs. Olivia Rouamba holds a doctorate in international relations. She started her diplomatic career in 2003 at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Mrs. Rouamba has served as Director General of Bilateral Cooperation, and Second Counselor at Burkina Faso's Embassy in South Africa. On September 15, 2021 she was appointed by the Council of Ministers as Burkina Faso's Ambassador to Ethiopia, as well as Permanent Representative to the African Union and the United Nations Economic Commission for Africa. Following the January coup, she was appointed as Minister for Foreign Affairs by interim President Paul-Henri Sandaogo Damiba on March 5, 2022, as part of the transitional government.



H.E. Ms. Retno L. P. Marsudi
Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Indonesia

Ms. Retno L. P. Marsudi was born in Semarang, 27 November 1962. Appointed on 27 October 2014, she is the first female Foreign Minister of Indonesia. Minister Marsudi graduated in 1985 from Universitas Gadjah Mada, Yogyakarta, and majored in International Relations. She has also pursued several other studies, namely "European Union Law" at the Haagse Hogeschool in Den Haag, and "Human Rights Study" at the Oslo University.



H.E. Ms. Dominique Hasler
**Minister for Foreign Affairs, Education, and Sport of the
Principality of Liechtenstein**

She holds a Master's degree in Entrepreneurial Management from the University of Liechtenstein. She was appointed as Foreign Minister of Liechtenstein in March 2021, succeeding Katrin Eggenberger. Prior to her appointment, Ms. Hasler served as the Minister of Home Affairs, Education and Environment. In 2017, she held a position as a Member of the Board of Management at the Liechtenstein Foundation for the Care of the Elderly and Sick (LAK) and as the Director of Organisation Development and Communications.



H.E. Ms. Naledi Pandor
**Minister of International Relations and Cooperation of the
Republic of South Africa**

Ms. Naledi Pandor holds a Master's degree in Education from the University of London. She was appointed as the Minister of International Relations and Cooperation of the Republic of South Africa on June 30, 2019. Prior to that Ms. Pandor was appointed as the Minister of Higher Education and Training from 2018 to 2019 and Minister of Science and Technology from 2014 to 2018.



Ms. Stephanie Copus Campbell
**Ambassador at Large on Gender Equality of the
Commonwealth of Australia**

Ms. Stephanie Copus Campbell holds a Master of Philosophy from Cambridge University in international relations and a Bachelor's degree from the University of California in political science, where she graduated Summa Cum Laude. She has a distinguished and lengthy career, working across the public, private, philanthropic and community sectors in Australia and the Indo Pacific. Stephanie is a founding Director on the Femili PNG Board, the PNG City Pharmacy Group Board and a previous Director for UNICEF Australia and the Harold Mitchell Foundation boards and an advisor to the University of New South Wales Canberra.



Ms. Ana Nemba Uaiene
Ambassador of the Republic of Mozambique (Special Envoy)

Ms. Ana Nemba Uaiene concluded the PhD programme curriculum in International Relations and Diplomacy at the Centre d'Etudes Diplomatiques et Strategiques (CEDS), France. She began her diplomatic career in 1981 at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Previously she served as the Ambassador of Mozambique to the Kingdom of Belgium, Netherland and Gran Dutch of Luxembourg. Also, she served as the Ambassador to the Republic of France, People's Democratic Republic of Ethiopia from 2001 to 2011.



Ms. Pamela Coke-Hamilton
Executive Director of the International Trade Center

Ms. Coke-Hamilton has a breadth of experience and expertise in trade-related capacity-building and sustainable development and a deep understanding of the challenges faced by vulnerable economies. She also established the Women Empowered through Export platform to address the disadvantages facing women-owned firms. She began her career in Jamaica's Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Foreign Trade, and served as Director of Trade, Tourism and Competitiveness of the Organization of American States and as Executive Director of the Caribbean Export Development Agency. She was appointed as Executive Director of the International Trade Centre in 2020.



Dr. Oyun Sanjaasuren
Director of External Affairs of the Green Climate Fund

Ms. S.Oyun has a Ph.D in Earth Sciences from University of Cambridge and worked in private sector prior entering politics. She served as the first President of the United Nations Environment Assembly, a governing body of UN Environment, and served as Chair of the Global Water Partnership, a global multi-stakeholder partnership of more than 3,000 partners promoting water security. Previously, she served five consecutive terms as a Member of Parliament in Mongolia including as Minister of Foreign Affairs and Minister of Environment.
